

Kawau Island project updates

Kawau Island Operations Update - 20-27 August

We've started targeted hunting in the northern blocks to maintain pressure on populations across the island. This is to help suppress wallaby and possum numbers while eradication efforts continue in the south.

From Wednesday 20 August to Wednesday 27 August, we'll move into Block 7 (refer to map), with hunting only on properties where access has been granted to team members Paul Prip, Laurie Mathews and Jez Scott, along with indicator dog Hoi. They will be walking Block 7 to familiarise themselves with the area ahead of night hunting.

What:

- Field team site familiarisation.
- Targeted night hunting (firearms with suppressors, strict safety protocols in place).

Where:

- Block 7, Moana Creek, Starboard Arm (west side), Beaumont Point, Pemples, Vivian & Little Vivian Bay (see map) - ONLY on properties where access has been granted.

When:

- Wednesday 20 through to Thursday 21 August - daytime site familiarisation walkthrough,
- From 6pm each evening, from Wednesday 20 August through to Wednesday 27 August (weather permitting), night hunting only on properties where access has been granted.

Kawau Island Operations Update – 13-17 August

Night hunting operations will take place from Wednesday 13 August to Sunday 17 August, where landowner permission has already been granted.

What:

- Targeted night hunting (firearms with suppressors, strict safety protocols in place).
- Further site familiarisation – if you would like to meet the team or point out anything specific on your property, please contact your community liaisons to arrange a time.

Where:

- Block 8 (refer to map above) - ONLY on properties where access has been granted.

When:

- Wednesday 13 August – Sunday 17 August.
- After 6pm.

Kawau Island Operations Update – 22 July to 10 August

Hunting in Department of Conservation reserves and surrounding residential areas.

Over the next three weeks, the field team will be making a concentrated push in Block 1 - Department of Conservation Kawau Island Historic Reserve and Stoney Hill Recreational Reserve and surrounding residential areas.

This is an important stage of the operation to target hot spots of activity as much as possible before a daytime grid search is scheduled and the specialist possum team come through the residential areas in August.

How you can help:

If you have seen any recent possum or wallaby activity on your property, please email: kawau@islandconservation.org. Sharing date/time/location details helps us direct the field team to exactly where they're needed most. A reminder this work is only on properties where we already have permission granted.

What:

- Drone survey and hunting, firearms are fitted with suppressors to reduce noise
- Shots will only be taken if completely safe to do so, following strict safety protocols.

Where:

- Block 1 - Department of Conservation Reserves Historic Reserve and Stoney Hill Recreational Reserve
- Residential areas where landowner permission has been granted in Schoolhouse, Sunny, Harris, and Karaka Bay.

When:

- Night-time drone survey and hunting in DOC reserves: From Tuesday, 22 July to Sunday 10 August between 5pm and 9am.
- Night-time drone survey and hunting in residential areas - Exact dates/times to be confirmed directly to residents of Schoolhouse, Sunny, Harris and Karaka Bay.

Kawau Island Operations Update – 18 or 19 July

1080 & Feratox ground-based bait deployment, weather dependent

Restoring Kawau Island's unique native biodiversity continues to progress. With the hunting operation well underway in the southern blocks, we are now preparing for the next stage of targeted wallaby and possum removal.

What:

Targeted use of toxins 1080 and Feratox to control wallabies and possums.

- Ground-based at monitored stations, not aerially applied.
- Bait will be out for a few days before removal from treatment area.
- Application of toxins will be in accordance with strict permit conditions.

Where:

- Blocks 2 through to 6 - only properties where landowner permission has been granted.
- In accordance with exclusion and buffer zones prescribed by National Public Health Service – Northern Region Auckland.
- Where wallaby and possum numbers are high. Where practicable, carcasses will be retrieved.

When:

- Bait will be deployed from either Friday 18 or Saturday 19 July (weather dependent).
- Uneaten bait will be removed next week.

Safety information:**Pets**

- Please always keep dogs on-lead and away from baited areas. Dogs are highly vulnerable to 1080 and Feratox poisoning if baits are ingested directly.
- A carcass containing 1080 can remain toxic for up to four months. A six-month caution period will be observed, during which signage will remain. It is important that people follow safety precautions and instructions during this time.
- Carcass breakdown time will be monitored.
- Free canine muzzles and emetic medication is available from **Warkworth Vets**, 23 Hudson Road, Warkworth. Phone 09 425 8244.

People and children

- Obey all posted warning signs. Do not touch bait that is dyed green.
- Supervise children and keep them away from treatment areas while bait is deployed.
- If you think someone has been poisoned, call the New Zealand National Poisons Centre immediately - 0800 764 766.

Hunting notifications:

- Further hunting notifications will be sent directly to residents and landowners in Block 1 where more hunting and possum trapping is planned from 22 July.
- More hunting notifications will be sent directly to residents and landowners in Block 1 and Block 2 where follow-up hunting and possum trapping are planned.

Kawau Island Operations Update – 12-15 July

Pest Free Kawau: Block 8 site familiarisation and night hunting notification

This weekend, the hunting team will be out on foot in the peninsula area between Bon Accord Harbour and North Cove (Block 8). Team members Lennard Sparks, Paul Prip, and Laurie Mathews will be accompanied by their indicator dogs, Marly and Tibby, as they walk through the area to get familiar with the terrain ahead of planned night-time hunting. They will only be on properties where landowner access has already been granted.

Where:

- [Block 8 between Bon Accord Harbour & North Cove](#) (PDF 1.8MB) — **ONLY on properties where access has been granted.**

What:

- Field team site familiarisation
- Targeted night hunting (firearms with suppressors, strict safety protocols in place)

When:

- Saturday 12 and Sunday 13 July - site familiarisation walk through
- From the evening of Sunday 13 July - Tuesday 15 July (weather permitting) - Night hunting only on properties where access has been granted

Kawau Island Operations Update – 16 June onward

Where:

- Block 1 DOC Kawau Island Historic Stoney Hill Recreational Reserve
- Schoolhouse, Sunny and Harris Bays (by permission only)

What:

- Thermal-assisted hunting
- Drone surveys
- Continuation of wildlife camera monitoring

When:

- Monday 16 June - Friday 27 June 2025
- No hunting during Matariki Weekend (20-22 June)
- Hunting hours in DOC reserves: 4pm – 9am
- The operational team will contact residents and landowners of Schoolhouse, Sunny and Harris Bays directly to confirm dates for targeted follow-up work.

Important safety note:

Do not enter the Kawau Island Historic Reserve or Stoney Hill Recreational Reserve between **4pm-9am**.

There will be **no hunting in DOC reserves** over the Matariki long weekend.

Possum detection work:

The possum team and indicator dogs are currently surveying and trapping the DOC reserves. They are expected to visit Schoolhouse Bay in July or early August — exact dates to be confirmed.

Kawau Island Operations Update – 9 June onward

Where:

- Blocks 2 and 3 including South Cove — only on properties where access has been granted.

What:

- Field team site familiarisation in South Cove residential area
- Evening drone surveys
- Targeted night hunting (firearms with suppressors, strict safety protocols)
- Daytime possum survey with possum indicator dog.

When:

- Wednesday, 11 June from 10 AM - Residential walkthrough
- From 11 June (weather permitting) - Evening drone surveys
- 11-12 June - Hunting in block 3 where access has been granted
- 13-20 June (weather permitting) - Night hunting in South Cove (after 8:00 PM) only on properties where access has been granted
- Daytime possum survey work - Date to be confirmed.

Another update will be scheduled shortly with details on follow up hunting in hotspots in Block 1.

Kawau Island Operations Update – 23 May onward

The field team will soon begin work in Blocks 2 and 3. This does not yet include the South Cove residential area.

However, as South Cove borders properties where operations are underway, they may hear some night-time activity such as firearms or drone surveys. Field work also continues in the DOC Kawau Island Historic and Stoney Hill Reserves through to the end of May.

Where:

- Blocks 2 and 3 (excluding South Cove residential area)
- Block 1 – DOC Kawau Island Historic and Stoney Hill Reserve

What:

- Night hunting with suppressor-equipped firearms (only when safe, under strict protocols)
- Evening drone surveys
- Possum trapping
- Ongoing wildlife camera monitoring

When:

- Block 2 & 3 operations begin 23 May
- DOC Reserve operations continue through to end of May

Later in June, the field team will walk through South Cove to familiarise themselves with the layout, introduce themselves and the indicator dogs prior to any operational activity. The operational team will be in contact with residents and landowners of South Cove about when this will be.

Kawau Island Operations Update – Starting 1 May

The weather window is looking good for pest eradication operations on Kawau Island to begin the evening of Thursday, 1 May, 2025.

The hunting team will begin in the Department of Conservation [Kawau Island Historic Reserve and neighbouring Stoney Hill Recreational Reserve \(Block 1\)](#).

Where:

- DOC Kawau Island Historic Reserve
- Stoney Hill Recreational Reserve

What:

- Thermal-assisted hunting and drone surveys
- Indicator dog surveys
- Wildlife camera monitoring

When:

- 1 – 30 May

Hunting hours:

- 5pm to 8am daily

For your safety:

Do not enter the Kawau Island Historic Reserve and Stoney Hill Recreational Reserve between the hours of **5:00 PM to 8:00 AM** during this period.

You might see the field team during the day, with indicator dogs Tibby, Lizzy or Rex. This will be for surveying purposes or traversing to another area on Kawau. Feel free to stop and have a chat with the team.

Next steps:

The field team will walk through the **Schoolhouse, Sunny and Harris Bay** areas to familiarise

themselves with the layout, introduce themselves and the indicator dogs prior to any operational activity. The operational team will be in contact with residents and landowners of **Schoolhouse, Sunny and Harris Bay** about when this will be.

We are committed to keeping disruption to a minimum and working respectfully with all landowners in accordance with property access agreements.
